Postgraduate Apprenticeship:

Fees for teacher training are funded by the apprentice levy. You are/will be employed in your existing school. You must have a degree + GCSEs in Maths and English for secondary, and have a degree + GCSEs in Maths, English and Science for primary.

#### Who: Teacher degree Not yet available apprenticeships:

Fees for teacher training are funded by the apprentice levy. Gain a degree and QTS while working. This is new and being piloted.

# High potential initial teacher training (HPITT):

The high-potential ITT route is a national 2-year employment-based initial teacher training and leadership development programme that seeks to recruit and train high-potential graduates and career changers who would be otherwise unlikely to join the profession or work in a school.

**Assessment Only Route:** 

A postgraduate route with no training for those who hold a degree and have taught in school. You will need to be employed in a school, have had at least two years teaching experience and at least 6 weeks experience in a contrasting school. You will need a degree + GCSEs in Maths and English for

secondary, and a degree + GCSEs in Maths, English and Science for primary.
